

PILBARA OPERATIONS

- QUBE have +400 staff in Port Hedland with approximately 60% local and 40 % FIFO
- QUBE own and operate a 100 man camp in Port Hedland used to support our FIFO employees
- QUBE operate the Utah Point Bulk Handling Facility receiving +500 quad road train deliveries EVERY DAY to export up to 24Mtpa
- QUBE operate the East Side wharf facilities using QUBE owned Mobile Harbour Crane for bulk export & break bulk cargoes
- QUBE handle and transport approximately 6,000,000 tonnes of bulk cargos per annum in the Pilbara



Causes of fatal motor vehicle accidents in Australia in 2020


















