Initiated under the Pilbara Juvenile Crime Working Group which was established by the Pilbara Development Commission in 2022.

Pilbara Safe Spaces

Will provide a safe culturally informed location for young children who are on the streets at night and at risk.

Codesigned in partnership with Department of Communities and Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations in Newman and Hedland.

Funded by BHP and Fortescue
through the Resources
Community Investment Initiative
for five years.

Newman Safe Spaces delivered by KJ in partnership with Newman Women's Shelter.

Pilbara Safe Spaces

Hedland Safe Spaces delivered by Julyardi Aboriginal Corporation under the guidance of the Hedland Aboriginal Strong Leaders.

Pilbara Safe Spaces

Newman Indigenous Healing Service funded by State Government to support the delivery of Newman Safe Spaces.

Pilbara Safe Spaces

Hedland and Newman Safe Spaces are expected to commence shortly, once refurbishment of their facilities is completed.



Pilbara Safe Spaces

A full evaluation of the Pilbara Safe Spaces Program will commence in 2025 and inform any adjustments or changes to the delivery of the services.
